Also reminded to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues – Follow Catch it, Bin it, Kill it and to avoid touching face, eyes, nose or mouth with unclean hands.</p> <p>To help reduce the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) reminding everyone of the public health advice - https://www.publichealth.hscni.net/news/covid-19-coronavirus</p> <p>Posters, leaflets and other materials will be on display.</p> <p>Cllr Shaw to be advised to use gloves when cleaning the court.</p> <p>Cllr Simon Richardson to mark the court and entrances with self distancing arrows and lines.</p> <p>RULES FOR THE COURT</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. If you are self-isolating or have symptoms of Covid19 you are not allowed to play on this court. 2. You must use both gates to enter and leave the court. 3. Do not touch any surfaces such as the gates, net or fence. 	<p>Cleaning of court by Cllr Lindsay Shaw.</p> <p>Chair Simon Richardson to carry out court markings.</p>	<p>Weekly or more often</p> <p>Before the court is opened.</p>	

			<p>4. Hand Sanitise before entering the court and on leaving.</p> <p>5. No more than 4 players allowed on court at any one time from a maximum of 2 households.</p> <p>6. Players must use their own rackets and balls which must be sanitised before and after use.</p> <p>7. Follow the arrows to change sizes clockwise.</p> <p>8. Keep 2 metres apart at all times.</p> <p>9. Limit your game to one hour to gives a chance.</p> <p>10. Do not congregate on the court before you start or when you stop play.</p> <p>11. Children under 12 years are not allowed on the court unsupervised.</p> <p>12. No other sports equipment such as footballs or netballs to be allowed on the court.</p> <p>This court will be regularly sanitized and monitored. If the rules are seen to be ignored then the Parish Council reserves the right to close the court IMMEDIATELY. By order of Staverton Parish Council.</p>
